TOYS AT SCHOOL

This includes when students are outside before school - no home soccer, basket, and/or wall balls. We will call you if we need your help in establishing this rule.

SAFETY BEFORE SCHOOL

There is no adult supervision on the playground before school **UNTIL 8:35AM**. We see students playing on the playground before 8:35AM. We will send home waivers that you can sign if you drop your children off before school, stating that we are not responsible. This is an extremely serious issue of safety and we are sorry that we must take this approach.
